Mrs. Furry stated she talked with a representative from ONG, and they provided information that if an agreement would have been in place in 2023 at a fee of 2% the town would have received around \$3,852.00. The franchise would only apply to those who currently receive natural gas from ONG and those in the future.

Trustee Dicksion stated it would be a benefit to have an agreement in place for any future economic growth and development.


Map of Affected Area:
